#### Part B1 – Applications under Christian Faith

Points are awarded for attendance at Christian public worship. "Christian church" means a church which is designed under the Ecumenical Relations Measure 2018, national by the Archbishop of Canterbury and York or locally by the Diocesan Bishop. This includes:

- Member churches of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland.
- Churches affiliated to the Evangelical Alliance.
- Partner churches of Affinity.
- Churches which are members of the Fellowship of Evangelical Churches.

"Christian worship" is defined as attendance at one or more of the following:

- Public worship in church or chapel led by an accredited priest/minister/pastor/elder/lay-reader, outside of the school day. Public worship can be on any day of the week.
- Sunday School.
- Messy Church.
- A church youth group/explorers/pathfinders which includes worship (must be approved by the accredited leader of worship).

**Attendance** at public worship at a Christian church by the child and/or one parent/legal guardian is counted over the period of 5 academic years (September to August), 2018 to 2023. Religious leader to insert number of weekly attendances (Sunday to Saturday) by the child and/or one parent/legal guardian up to a maximum of 39 per year x 5 years maximum (to 31<sup>st</sup> August each year).

**Due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic,** attendance at public worship for 2019-20 will only be counted up to 17<sup>th</sup> March 2020. Points will not be awarded for the period from 18<sup>th</sup> March 2020 due to national restrictions imposed on churches and places of worship. The most points awarded for 2019-20 shall be 20. For the avoidance of doubt, whilst we would ordinarily have sought evidence of attendance for the academic year 2020-21, this year will not be counted due to the impact of Covid restrictions. Counting of attendance recommenced on 31st October 2021. The maximum points that can be awarded for the year 1st September 2021 to 31st August 2022 will be 33 to proportionately reflect the reduction in months. These changes are reflected in the attendance points table under section B1.
